Pastor's Letter: May 19, 2024 **Pentecost**

Sunday

God's New Creation is Perfected in Pentecost.

Of all the Old Testament festivals, two have become major solemnities in the Church. The first is Passover (Pascha or Easter) and the second is Pentecost (Shavuot, meaning Weeks and is the Festival of The Law, The Torah) established when God gave Moses the Law at Mt. Sinai and celebrated 50 days (7x7).

When we talk in terms of a new creation or a birthday, we see that the Holy Spirit is truly a Person, not a thing: the Divine Protector.

"[As] the Gospel goes out into the pagan world, one of the things that miracles and tongues are going to function as are signs of the supernatural character of the Gospel. They're signs that the Church isn't just a human institution, but a divine institution"

'Receive The Holy Spirit'

Who is the Holy Spirit? is the correct way to ask this question because the Holy Spirit is a Person. A Divine Person, the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, "equal in dignity and majesty with the Father and the Son: the Holy Spirit is one member of the Holy Trinity."

"As a Person, the Holy Spirit is one we can be in relation with. We can know and love the Holy Spirit just as we know and love the Father and the Son. And the Spirit loves us just as He loves the Father and the Son.

Personhood means there is potential for love and union. The Holy Spirit has an intellect and will, and with those characteristics freely knows and loves as God."

Fire Devastates St. William Parish



In the early morning hours on May 1, a massive fire ravaged St. William Catholic Church in Cashion, Ariz., near Avondale. The church, which serves 1,000 families, the parish hall, classrooms and foodbank are a complete loss. The foodbank, led by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, served 25 families or more every week. Officials are working hard to determine the cause of the fire.

This is a tight-knit community, many of whom have been attending the church for decades. The aftermath of this fire is heartbreaking to the community affected. Families of children preparing for baptism or confirmation, young couples preparing to be married, will now change their plans. This community will look to the future as plans for their parish come together.

While St. William Parish was fully insured, there will be other funds needed to assist the staff and community to address unknown expenses and needs that will not be covered by insurance. There has been an outpouring of calls from people across the diocese wondering how they can help.

This loss is a tragedy, but we know that as Catholics, it is the people that make a Church, not a building. We are all part of the universal Church—together as one body in Christ.




